Overview:

The course is suitable for people who have a professional interest in language testing, including those working in small-scale testing operations. It is also suitable for teachers who would like to develop their knowledge and understanding of statistics in language assessment. This course is not particularly theoretical, technical or based around a specific software programme, but aims to help people who are involved or interested in language testing better understand the role of statistics and how to interpret them when working with analysts and other colleagues. The course will have a practical focus.

This course provides an overview of the different stages at which statistics are useful throughout the cycle of designing, validating, managing and reviewing a language exam, and suggestions for practical follow-up action. No previous knowledge of statistics is required; however, depending on the strengths of the group and their level of familiarity with different aspects, time devoted to different analyses is flexible within each session.
