 - Detailed information










Countries setting requirements: percentages






Language level requirements across contexts


















Development over time

How to report development over time?

Challenge:

The number of participating countries differ from year to year.


More countries setting requirements in 2018 may reflect a higher number of responding countries

Two approaches:

- 1) comparison the state of the art the different years
- 2) comparison the development in countries responding to all four surveys (n = 19)






Figure 14. Requirement prior to entry in 2009, 2013 and 2018 (all countries)


Figure 18. Requirements for citizenship in 2007, 2009, 2013 and 2018 (all countries)


Figure 15. Requirements prior to entry (19 contexts)


Figure 17. Requirements for permanent residency (subset)

Summing up trends

- More countries set requirements in 2018 than in 2017
- The requirements are getting stricter
 - Prior to entry:
 - more countries set requirements
 - A1 replaces other levels (unspecified in particular)
 - Permanent residency:
 - more countries set requirements
 - the requirements have not gotten stricter
 - A2 replaces other levels
 - Citizenship:
 - the number of countries setting requirements have doubled
 - the requirements are getting stricter
 - B1 replaces other levels (also some setting B2)
